

LifeGroup Questions of Self-Feeding Program Week 2 - The Lord's Prayer

Share your experiences in your faith journey concerning the Lord's Prayer? (Matthew 6:9-13)
How have you seen it being used? How have you personally engaged with the prayer?

I suggest that Jesus used this prayer as a tool kit of prayers that can be drawn upon to lean into different attributes of God. Below are the attributes that I want to suggest the prayer leans into. (These attributes were suggested by Tim Piesse from Crossway Baptist Church)

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| ▪ “Our Father in heaven,
hallowed be your name, | Father |
| ▪ ¹⁰ your kingdom come,
your will be done,
on earth as it is in heaven. | King |
| ▪ ¹¹ Give us today our daily bread. | Provider |
| ▪ ¹² And forgive us our debts,
as we also have forgiven our debtors. | Forgiver |
| ▪ ¹³ And lead us not into temptation, | Protector |
| ▪ deliver us from the evil one.’ | Deliverer |



Going through each attribute, when might be a time in your life you might be particularly needing to lean into that attribute of God?

What might be helpful about seeing the Lord's Prayer in this way?

Read Matthew 26:39-42. How many times in the passage does Jesus say things that can be connected to lines in the Lord's Prayer in Matthew 6:9-13?

What parts of the Lord's prayer have you been needing to lean into and pray from recently?

Isaiah 40:31 promises strength to those who place their hope in the Lord. The Lord's Prayer is a tool to empower you to regularly place your hope in the Lord in different ways.
